And today, we'll be covering the next reason on our list why you might not be able to get your orchid to rebloom... So let's get to it!

## THE TOP 10 REASONS WHY YOUR ORCHID WON'T REBLOOM

### REASON #4:

#### Not Giving Your Orchid Enough Water

A few newsletters ago, we talked about some of the problems associated with OVER-watering...

...but UNDER-watering your orchid can also be a reason why you might be having trouble getting blooms on your plant.

A quick and easy way to tell if you're under-watering is to gently remove your plant from the pot and take a look at the roots.

Simply take a knife and gently scrape around the edges of the potting matter, put your hand over the potting matter, turn the pot over, and remove the plant.

You'll see dry and shriveled roots if your plant is not getting enough water. The potting material will be bone dry, and potentially even rock hard.

Depending on the severity of the problem, you may need to remove some of the roots, and repot the plant in new potting matter (we explain how to do this with step-by-step photos in our book), or you can try placing the plant back in the pot as is, and increase your watering schedule.

Potting matter should be damp, but not overly wet.

For a quick rule of thumb, stick your finger 1-2 inches into the potting matter. If it feels moist, then you don't need to water. But, if it's dry to the touch, then it's time to give your plant some water!

In the next newsletter, we'll be covering the #3 Reason why your orchid won't bloom - and if you've been having trouble getting your orchid to flower, this is where you'll want to really start paying close attention :-)
